In maths, we have been measuring different objects and have been putting them in order from shortest to longest. To mark the General Election, Rabbit Class have had an election of their own! The children voted for the person they would like to be our Chief Playground Buddy. They have all really enjoyed filling in the ballot papers and posting them at our polling station.

Deer Class

Year 5 have started their week by writing a recount about the visit of John (the Greek man). It has been great being able to remember all the fantastic things that we did on the day. In maths we have worked hard to find missing lengths and angles of shapes. We even had an extra maths lesson from Aysha who taught us all about adding fractions and solving problems involving this. Continuing with our Greek topic, we have learned about the Olympics and their origins. Did you know that they used to run races naked and in full armour?

Hedgehog Class

This week we have been learning all about democracy and the General Election. We looked at party manifestos and decided who we would vote for (if we were 18!). We then voted and put this data in a tally chart and graph. The children then created their own manifesto and shared their ideas with the class. There were some fabulous ideas such as; helping the homeless, keeping the environment and rivers clean and building cheaper homes! We have also been busy playing recorders and reading music! It sounded beautiful!

We have had a great first week back in Dormice class! This week we have been busy learning all about the general election! We thought about what we would do if we became the leader of our school! Miss Black then chose some children for the election and we all had to vote! It was all very exciting! We have all been working really hard to practice our Read Write Inc. sounds and words with our sounds in them. All the children are trying really hard and are making so much progress. Phonics screening will run from Monday 12th – Friday 17th June so please try your best to get all children in school.

Duckling Class

This week we are finding out all about different animals. Our story and song is '10 in the bed' and it is helping us to practise our numbers. We have also been finding out about 'more or less.' Our reading morning will be back on again next Wednesday – we hope to see you there!!!

Fox Class

Fox Class have enjoyed learning about the General Election this week. We learnt about different political parties and the manifestos they have written. We used the manifestos to create our own version. Fox Class carried out a general election vote to see which party they would put into power, if they were old enough to vote. The children were all very enthusiastic and enjoyed learning about the British Democracy voting system. In Maths, we have been learning about lines of symmetry. We carried out an investigation to find out how many lines of symmetry different 2D shapes have.
