This week in Starfish Class we have been learning all about co-ordinating conjunctions! We have learnt a new story called 'Cat, Bramble and Heron' and have been trying really hard to include co-ordinating conjunctions into our writing. We have been super busy in Jellyfish class this week. We have been making wedding outfits for Betty and Harry (the scarecrows in our story). In our Talk for Writing, we have been writing lists and we have all been practising writing our names.

Stingray

This week in Talk for Writing the have learnt and written the story 'The Three Bears'. We have been learning to use 'and' to join two sentences. In maths, we have tried hard to understand positional language used to order objects. We have use lots of resources to help you understand. On Tuesday, we carried out a 'smell' investigation where we 'blind tested' 6 smell boxes. We LOVED some of the smells and HATED others. You might be able to smell them still in our classroom!

Turtle

This week, Year 6 have been doing Mock SATs. They have all had a fantastic attitude towards these and we are proud of them all. We have also been continuing our French learning at school and they are developing a flair for speaking in a different language. Feel free to ask them to talk to you in French about different items and shops.

Lobster.

Lobster Class have had an amazing week identifying features of a diary entry. We have written our own diary entries, getting inspiration from the book Stone Age Boy. In Maths, we have been learning about counting in 25s. Most children did very well and could continue the sequence. Some found this difficult and are slowly learning about this by using equipment to help us. In science, we have been learning about different organs in our body. Children are now able to identify most organs in the human body. How clever are they!

Angelfish

In Talk for writing, Year 3 have been reading diary extracts, including one of a stone age child- we have discovered their days were A LOT different to ours! In Maths we have begun to use our knowledge of place value to add and subtract a 1-digit number to and from a 3- digit number. We have had great fun in Science doing a 'Bubbly Rocks' experiment! We tested the permeability of different rocks and recorded our results!

Parrot Fish

This week in maths, Parrot Fish have moved on to addition and subtraction. We used the column method to add numbers over four digits. Parrot Fish have also worked really hard this week to produce some fantastic independent writing, all about exploring different places around the world. In Science, we investigated the hardness of different materials in the classroom.

Seahorse

This week, we have been very busy innovating the story 'Dear Zoo'. We changed the story to 'Dear Shop' and created our own text maps to help us recite our ideas. We are looking forward to learning a new story next week! In maths, we have tried really hard to find 1 more than a given number using different objects to help us. Despite finding this a little bit tricky, the children persevered and remained positive throughout their learning. Keep it up!
