This week, we have been learning all about the human body. We have been investigating the changes that happen to the male and female body during puberty.

This week we have been finding out all about farms in readiness for our trip to Pink Pig Farm. We have used our imagination and muscles to make a tractor both inside and out, we have made pigs and are also going to be making some sausage rolls for snack! The lovely weather has given us a great chance to think about being safe in the sun and we have designed a new sun hat.

Angelfish

The children have been learning how mining works in the present day. Year 3 have investigated the machines that are now used and agree that technology has moved on a lot from the Victorian days! The children have written a great description using fronted adverbials to describe what happens. We hope that the members of our class who went to the Water Park had a brilliant time! We look forward to seeing some of you on transition afternoon on Monday at 2pm.

This week, we consolidated our knowledge of shapes. The children are fantastic at naming 2D and 3D shapes and explaining the difference between them.
